VA. TECH RESEARCH PANEL SEEKS INPUT FROM NEW YORK LAW ENFORCEMENT EXECUTIVES

The Panels moderator will be Martin D. Ficke, SES Director of Investigations. A 33 year veteran federal agent, Mr. Ficke recently retired as Special Agent in Charge of the New York Office of the Department of Homeland Security, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Office of Investigations.

Mr. Schnur stated that, " Holding these types of discussions with learned, veteran law enforcement officers may help law enforcement to be better prepared to respond to critical incidents and help protect the public."
